As part of Churches Together in Bury we pray for our brothers and sisters at St. Peter's, especially their priest, Rev. Simon Watkinson.


Children

Bible Study Lent 2023 - Failure, Dust and Glory

This Lent we are all invited to explore how we can live well with the mess of everyday life. The sessions are based on the book 'Failure' by Bishop Emma Ineson and the 'Dust & Glory daily reflections'. They encourage us to take a fresh look at the frustrations and failings that every day brings and, rather than pretending we can always avoid them, seek to learn from them and grow closer to God through them. We will be joined by All Saints & St James. Each session will last approximately an hour with some fellowship time afterwards with tea and bickies (other refreshments will be available. It will consist of:-

- Introduction led by the facilitator(15min)
- Discussion and time for thoughts about the Daily Reflections of the previous week. (30min)
- Prayer this may be quiet, Compline, Celtic etc. (15min)
